On behalf of the Donna M. Crandall Memorial Foundation Board of Directors, thank you for sharing this special night with us. As the Foundation celebrates its 18th anniversary, we are thrilled to report that together we have raised over two and a half million dollars to help our friends and neighbors affected by CF, the same disease Donna battled for 41 years.

Donna was diagnosed with CF as a small child. Her parents were told she would not live long enough to go to college, have a career, or a family. Donna defied all the odds and predictions. She was a devoted wife and mother. She was a 1979 graduate of Siena College and worked as a manager for the retirement services group at Ayco for nearly twenty years. While she had many passions, supporting her family was by far her greatest one.

Donna was fiercely independent and rarely told people she had CF. She did not want people to feel sorry for her or treat her special. She worked hard to earn the respect of others and never wanted to let those around her down. As her health declined, she needed to rely more heavily on friends and family. That support allowed her to live the life she wanted to have—attending her daughter Kerianne's many musical and athletic events and getting to work even when her list of meds and treatments grew longer. Tonight, we pay tribute to all family members and special friends who stand beside their loved ones as they navigate life with CF.

Donna M. Crandall Memorial Foundation Programs



Donna was acutely aware that many CF patients and families were overwhelmed by the financial constraints associated with this disease. It has always been our hope that by lessening the financial and practical pressures of CF, patients can focus more on enjoying time with family and friends.

The Donna Crandall Foundation is delighted to announce that after more than two years of fundraising, planning, and designing, construction on Dawn's Room began in the fall of 2018! In honor of our friend Dawn McGuinness, "**Dawn's Room**" will be a luxurious, beach-themed private room on Albany Med's adult CF floor. The room will have many amenities, including the only private bathroom on the floor. The final cost of Dawn's Room is \$85,000, and DMCF is so grateful for all of our special friends who have worked tirelessly with us to fundraise for this project.

Other funds raised by the Foundation are used in various ways. Our initial project, and one dear to our hearts, is the **gift bag program**. This year we delivered our 1800th bag to CF patient Sydney Reichart, who also found a check for \$1,800 dollars in with her goodies! The Foundation also pays for **miscellaneous hospital room expenses** for patients, who typically spend weeks at a time in the hospital several times a year. Costs covered include telephone access, TV service, parking passes for visitors, and cafeteria gift cards for families to purchase meals. The Foundation pays for hotel accommodations for family members across the street, at the Hilton Garden Inn, or in whatever city their CF journey takes them.

Throughout the year, the Foundation also provides patients who go to the CF clinic for check-ups with **seasonal, themed surprises**. A tin of cookies is always waiting for patients in December, and high school seniors receive a graduation check each June. To make this summer clinic visit a little brighter, the Foundation organized the "Catch of the Day" contest, in which patients had a chance to win \$20, \$50, or \$100. 125 patients participated, and the Foundation gave away \$10,000!

While these giveaways are part of the Foundation's ongoing effort to help make life with CF a little brighter, it has also been our privilege to be a **resource to those with a specific, significant financial challenge**. The Foundation sets aside \$100,000 a year dedicated to meeting these requests. From medical co-pays to paying a late bill or mortgage, with your support, we have never had to say no to those in need.



The Donna Crandall Foundation realizes first hand how this disease impacts the entire family and appreciates the important role family support provides to all patients. Tonight we celebrate all those who have stood by their loved ones and have been the anchor during stormy times.

Our video tonight will highlight the Potanovic/Wellington Family. Harriet and Francis were twins. They were inseparable as children so, it's not surprising they moved a few hundred steps away from each other once they got married. Harriet had five boys and a girl while Fran had the exact opposite. Together, this family shared the joys and heartaches of life.

They learned that CF would impact their family when Tommy, Harriet's fifth child was born. The remaining children in both families were tested for this genetic inherited disease. Tommy, Bobby, and Timmy would all have CF. Tonight's video will feature Francis Wellington, Mary Cora Wellington, KC Marcin, Maureen Natrella,



Ed Potanovic and Mary Potanovic. They will share one family's perspective on how CF has touched their lives, and the role that the Donna Crandall Foundation played in supporting them.

Burke P. Bear Awards: A Special Bear for Special People



Each year “Burke Bears” are presented to Donna M. Crandall Memorial Foundation volunteers who share our dedication to making life better for people living with CF.

We chose to use the bear as our symbol of gratitude because of its history: Burke P. Bear is a commemorative Boyd’s Bear created in 1997 to honor a young man and Teddy bear collector, Burke Derr of Pennsylvania. In February of that year, two of Burke’s friends wrote to G.M. Lowenthal, chief designer and president of The Boyd’s Collection, to share Burke’s story about his positive attitude despite his life with CF, his collection of 150+ Boyd’s Bears, and the fact that Burke had little time left. Mr. Lowenthal responded by promising that a fall collection bear would be named Burke P. Bear. Sadly, however, Burke’s health began to fail, so Boyd’s delivered a prototype directly to the hospital so he could see it. Burke died a week later, just two days before his 19th birthday.

Tonight we will present a Burke P. Bear to supporters who reflect Burke’s spirit and commitment. The recipients of this award have gone above and beyond to help the Donna Crandall Foundation. Three people will be recognized tonight for their devotion to the Foundation and in turn, to the CF patients we strive to serve.
